CAMPUS BACKGROUND

Sitting 50 miles northwest of Lubbock, Texas, Floydada Independent School District serves a rural community centered predominantly on agribusiness.

The district reaches 700+ students across its two campuses: AB Duncan Elementary School and Floydada High/ Jr High School.

Student demographics for AB Duncan Elementary include the following populations:

- 84.1% Latinx
- 10.5 Emergent Bilingual/ English Learners
- 3.6% Black
- 10.5% Special Education
- 11.1% White
- 80.2% Economically Disadvantaged Students

THE CHALLENGE

AB Duncan ES rated D from 2016-2019, with the 2020 school year unrated due to COVID impacts.

AB Duncan ES sought campus transformation in order to uplift their large population of economically disadvantaged students using high quality instructional materials and strategies.

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ENGAGEMENT + INSIGHTS

When reflecting on what aspects of SAF contributed to overall success, school leaders noted the following:

- Leveraging the Effective Schools Framework to guide strategic staffing
- Developing a school playbook uplifting a mission and visionaligned minxmin and staff script
- Building and upholding campus routines
- Supporting rigorous development of teacher content knowledge

- Conducting a highquality instructional materials audit
- Supporting teachers to break down standards
- Making space to preplan for misconceptions
- Developing true relationships with families with consistent communication

RECOMMENDATIONS

Build a Mission-Aligned Leadership Team

Strong leadership will create ripple effects of impact – from teachers to students and cafeteria workers to custodians.

Partner with Your Parents

Regularly involve parents in student data conversations. Discuss BOY data, projected growth, and progress towards their EOY goal.

Make Time for What is Important

Reconfigure your classroom and school schedules to prioritize PLCs and student intervention opportunities.
